INTER RELIGIOUS EFFORTS TO REDUCE HIV/AIDS AND MITIGATE ITS EFFECTS IN BUTULA DIVISION, BUSIA DISTRICT, WESTERN KENYA.

African Development and Emergency Organization (ADEO) through the support of Niwano peace foundation has increased the efforts of involving the religious leaders and faith based organizations to reduce infection and mitigate the effects of HIV. This was not the case earlier as the Government had spearheaded such efforts, leaving behind the faith led organizations.

The success of the program was based on the involvement of all the mainstream churches in Butula division, train the leaders in HIV/Aids management and sensitize their followers on the need to fight stigma and discrimination, offer support to those affected and infected and protect themselves from getting infected.

HIV/Aids was for a long time looked at as a medical condition that was a punishment from God for promiscuous people. Religious leaders were busy ostracizing people living with Aids at the same time conducting burial rights for the dead in large numbers.

The issue of condom use was out of the question as the religious group preached abstinence and being faithful for married couples, even where it this was not practical with the social set up.

This intervention has achieved allot in sensitizing the religious leaders themselves by understanding that if they don't take an active role and change their attitudes and those of their flock, soon the churches will be empty, due to illness and death occasioned by HIV/Aids.

The intervention was a first step, and continuity is strongly recommended for changes to be long lasting.

Prolonged illness and eventual death of parents have profound psychosocial effects on children but these receive less attention than physical needs. Illness and death of parents is extremely traumatic and may leave serious psychological scars. Interventions aimed at alleviating the physical conditions of people affected and infected as well as psychosocial needs of orphans. The intervention targeted infected parents to help them play normal parental and social roles and to give children opportunities to discuss their fear and dreams. Memory books were developed for this purpose. Psychosocial support interventions within HIV/AIDS program included

formation of peer education clubs, peer counselors and formation of church counseling groups.
