Universal Love Alliance is a public benefit and non-profit organization. ULA was established in Uganda in 2015. ULA's vision is to have a community free from discrimination based on religion, race, tribe, or gender identity; to empower our community towards an inclusive and diverse society, free from gender-based violence, and towards peaceful and harmonious living.

■ **Done activity by NPF Grant** \* Within 1000 characters

The first activity was an intensive two-day workshop for 25 faith leaders who had previously attended a ULA workshop supported by the U.S. Embassy in Kampala. This follow up workshop aimed at producing a network among those in attendance and to help them refine their action plans initially done at the Embassy workshop. The second activity was a one-day workshop for 50 attendees, some faith leaders, others community leaders. The goal of this activity was for them to jointly develop an action plan to promote human rights in Ugandan society.

■ **Output or Outcome** \* Within 1000 characters

The first workshop produced the desired result. Each attendee was able to present their modified action plan to a group of five other attendees, where it was critiqued with suggested improvements made. This followed the attendees receiving a variety of different types of training to sensitize them to the needs of LGBTIQ people and to promote human rights within their own churches. The second workshop was also successful. It began with a showing of the documentary, God Loves Uganda, and then built on the issues developed in that video. While there was some agreement that still more work needs to be done before implementation of a full action plan, as the workshop took place during the crisis when the "Kill the Gays" bill appeared a threat, the workshop provided solidarity for an alternative way to a Uganda where the human rights of all citizens would be protected and cherished.
