







# Interim Report of the workshop on Youth in Conflict Areas: Healing and Peace-building through Social Engagement

November 29th - December 4th, 2019; Nong Chok, Bangkok, Thailand

Co-hosted by: International Institute for Peace and Development Studies, NIWANO Peace Foundation, Asian Resource Foundation, Asian Muslim Action Network

#### Introduction

Asia is home to 60% of the global young population. According to the UN, in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, 60% of the global conflict takes place in the Asian region, where the youth definitely participates and gets affected. Hence there is an immediate need of addressing the prevailing negative impacts on the youth in conflict areas, although the damage done by the conflicts to the lives of the youth is not easy to heal and turning their lives back to normal is not a simple process.

The 5-day workshop on "Youth in Conflict Areas: Healing and Peace-building through Social Engagement", co-hosted by AMAN, ARF, NIWANO Peace Foundation and IIPDS was designed to empower the youth from different conflict zones of Asia by understanding the conflicts, it's dynamic, levels and ways.

#### **Participants**

31 young social workers, researchers, journalists, and media activists from 10 countries attended the workshop who were directly or indirectly affected and impacted by the conflicts in their respective regions.

Among the participants, there were 16 females and 15 males. There were 2 participants from Bangladesh, 1 from Cambodia, 6 from India, 2 from Indonesia, 4 from Myanmar, 1 from Nepal, 1 from Pakistan, 5 from Philippines, 1 from Sri Lanka, 6 from Thailand, 1 from Turkey and 1 participant from Viet Nam.
